The September meeting of the London Old Tablers' Society (better known as "LOTS") marked another landmark for 41 Club No.2 – one of the four founding clubs of the National Association of Ex-Tablers Clubs. LOTS held its' 750th meeting on 9th September at the Club's usual venue, the Farmers Club, overlooking the River Thames just off Whitehall in Central London.

The meeting was LOTS' annual joint meeting with City of London Round Table No.13 and was also attended by seven members of Antwerp 41 Club No.125 who had travelled to London specifically for the meeting. In addition to our Belgian visitors a total of 21 LOTS members plus a prospective new member, 11 members of City of London Round Table (including prospectives) and visitors from Clevedon, Bishops Stortford and Shirley Late Knights 41 Clubs were in attendance making a total of 43 Tablers & 41ers.

National President Jim Smith was accompanied by National Fellowship Officer Barry Durman, complete with the 41 Club Shop. He subsequently served with the UN in Cyprus and Germany before commanding the Green Howards in England, N Ireland, Germany and Kenya. Later, he was Commander, British Forces in Bosnia and Kosovo. He retired as Chief of the General Staff in 2009.

Lord Dannatt is President of Help for Heroes and holds the ceremonial post of Constable of the Tower of London. He is a cross bencher in the House of Lords and Deputy Lieutenant for Greater London and Norfolk.

A Norfolk man, he runs his family arable farm and is President of the Norfolk Churches Trust, YMCA Norfolk, the Army Benevolent Fund / Soldiers Charity in Norfolk. He is also Patron of the Royal British Legion in Norfolk.


