Andrew, the VP, and I have worked very closely together, so that not only do we solve the issues of the past, develop current problems into solutions, but plan for the future, so that a seamless working ethic for the "Presidents" role can pursue in the future.

So the team is in full work mode and hopefully getting the admin of the Club right. I must give special thanks to Graham, Sloan Region 5 Councillor, for all the hard work he has done with the GDPR and CAS updating of records.

Outstanding issues

CAS2

At the last board meeting we did agree to get an independent report/view on the replacement of the current CAS system. I have asked a few companies in this area and they are not interested to give a review without some guarantees they get a chance in providing a new system. This lead me in a different direction, one, to get a company/person to investigate our process to get a quote and two, to review the current CAS system ourselves. Both these investigations are currently underway I have had a meeting with a retired individual who until recently built database systems for large companies. On the 13th of September Andrew, Graham and myself met with Mike Gibbs. During this meeting we were given an insight into our current CAS system. I will not go into this now but will report in full when all the info comes in.





Rules, standing orders and Policies

Both Andrew and I are consistently frustrated with this issue. Gaining all the information needed to obtain reasonable checks and balances in order to give an accurate update to all the rules and therefore standing orders. Some policies are issues pertaining to the law of the land so can go ahead, but others are linked to conduct and discipline etc. need further approval and also the law of the land. The other issue is the health of the current Hon Solicitor and under no circumstances do I, or anyone on the board, want to put any unnecessary pressure on him.

Round Table

I have spoken with President Richard on quite a few occasions and also to Paul Agnew, the Vice, on various matters. The aim is to get a meeting of the Vices and Presidents to plan for the future of the two Associations. We hope to have this before the Council meeting in Hull or shortly afterwards. Richard and I have worked very closely to prevent any small issues to deviate us from our goal to provide a seamless support network for each of our Clubs.

The Four Club Family

I continually have communications with all the other three Clubs via WhatsApp and other appropriate means, to assist each other in whatever is necessary. I have voiced the opinion that Round Table must now start and not only ask us for help and assistance in recruiting for them, but to understand that they also have an obligation to assist in a seamless transition between Round Table and 41 Club. Sue Hill Tangent Vice President also voiced the same views between Circle and Tangent. I would also add that it is at grass roots level that we need to get this working, not in a board room. More on that later!

At the Board meeting in Aberdeen, job descriptions were discussed and as agreed, I reviewed, corrected and updated, the job profiles of the National Officers and Honorary Officers of the Association, with the exception of the IRO as the description was not made available. The revised documents have been circulated but to date, no feedback has been received. The expectations of roles need to be clear so that members who give their time should feel valued.

I was informed that the post of the IPP had changed and this needs clarification and further discussion. Historically, this post incorporated some form of Community Service project which helped to promote our organisation. This role would support our Association's purposes:

- ii) To encourage active involvement in the Community.
- iii) To use our experience in support of the Round Table Family.
- iv) To encourage international relationships.

Without discussion, I was advised that this role has been removed this year, although I note that the IPP had been placed on the Community Service Committee. The designated position has no clarity and to date has not been implemented. However, I have been able to advise and support individuals when required.

NATIONAL SECRETARY - SEAN MCCORMICK

So, post-AGM, the work doesn't cease. The preparation of the AGM minutes is a laborious, time-consuming task. We have an audio file that is some 4.5hrs long that needs transcribing, formatting and then formulated into a reasonable order so that the reader can understand exactly what is being debated, discussed, decided or presented. All without the benefit of not being able to see who it is that is speaking! This may be an action for later years, perhaps an edit from the guys operating the desk/audio as to who is speaking. I know that those coming to the stage for the first time always introduce themselves, but on subsequent occasions and from those who speak from the mics on the stage, identifying these from audio files is indeed a challenge.

Marchesi House – I popped in to see Bev a few weeks ago and have to say that they seem to be in a much happier place from when I last saw them just prior to AGM. There had been concerns following resignations from staff that support RTBI (around year-end), allied to a change in the systems they had been using and were used to. That now seems to have





settled down, Olivia is helping us out when we have our cyclical moments of extra work and it is all going well. Even down to the extra work required for the CAS updates generated by the GDPR returns instigated by Graham F Sloan as lead on the initiative/project.

CAS 2 – Now seemingly out of my hands and reported on by Phill from now on.

Policy Approval & Review – As noted from the June meeting, you asked for this to be deferred again as not enough time had been devoted to reading and analysing. This is despite them having been reviewed by the Special Purposes Committee of myself, Cormac Clancy and John Alford. All I can do is keep bringing it up in the hope that Council might come to a majority decision on this.

Correspondence Received – There were a couple of items that I thought may be of interest to Council and they are as follows:-

- 1) GDPR returns We've received some GDPR returns from a club who advised us they were in effect closed. This begs the question, did all their members know it was closed, and if they didn't but wish to remain in the Association, then by our rules the club cannot close. It also goes to show one of the benefits we have had from Graham F Sloan asking (& getting approved) for us to email all members, as opposed to just the club contacts.
- 2) 'Active' 41 Clubs I now have a few instances where an existing club have taken strongly against the formation of these new 'active' clubs. They are not objecting 'per se' to the formation of a new club, just the way these seem to have come about seemingly without any contact with the existing club. You all as National Councillors are out and about, up with events and have an ear to the ground. How would you feel if you found out through National that your own town/district suddenly has a new club and you knew nothing about it? They are also highlighting an interesting principle here, these new clubs are being bought about to help links with Table and 41 Club, but by providing no communication with the existing 41 Club, seem to be putting up barriers/distancing themselves further.

Generally – One of my responsibilities is the agreement of contracts between the Association and any third parties, contractors, delegated authorities, etc. You should know that I do this following the approval, comments, amendments, etc provided by the Honorary Solicitor. When, or if, he is not immediately available, I either take advice from another suitable individual (i.e. prior Honorary Solicitor, or another club member in the legal profession). I do try not to hold these contracts up, it is not simply a question of my signing a document & sending back, we try wherever possible to justify and legally protect ourselves and the Association by undertaking these tasks. Any delays in getting contracts returned is us trying to ensure our position.

Interim Accounts

I have produced the attached Interim accounts so you can see how things are going. Nothing particularly worrying at this stage.

For various reasons, explained at previous meetings, we have made a sizable surplus in both of the last two years. We are a non-profit-making organisation and hence we should not be afraid to run a deficit this year, provided we can demonstrate that we are spending funds wisely.

A few observations:

- Our year-end is 31 December so these accounts cover the first nine months to September 2018
- We have not spent anything on IT capital expenditure as yet
- 41 International subscriptions have been running over budget for the last few years. I
 have accrued an amount equal to last year
- Council expenses are going to be high this year due to the locations chosen but hopefully we will still be within budget
- I am still awaiting the final reckoning for Belfast Conference
- Torbay Conference funding rather high this was discussed with the Conference Treasurer and will be required until such time as cash flow permits repayment

Outstanding Capitation as per CAS

Please review the CAS page that shows Capitation paid (or unpaid) by your Region simply by navigating via the Treasurer section in CAS, or let me know and I will send you a link to it. Thanks to those that have worked on their list and tried/succeeded in provoking a response.

As per the interim accounts, we have collected 95% of the budgeted capitation for the year. Our cash position is strong, with £126k in Barclays and a further £100k in the 32 day deposit with Bank of Scotland.

NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP & ROUND TABLE LIASON OFFICER - NICK MORCUMB

Progress on key objectives:

My key aims are to support Round Tables, create new Round Tables, support 41 Clubs and improve conversion from Table to 41 Club which have involved the following activities:

- Help and advice to existing Clubs
- Help to restart new Round Tables/41 Clubs
- Attendance at local and Area/Regional events





- Attendance at National Events
- Attendance at National Meetings

Activity since Aberdeen:

Here is a summary of what I have been doing over the last 4 months:

- Liaising with Round Table National about "Discover Round Table" activities aimed at supporting existing Clubs and restarting new ones.
- Attend an event in Wrexham to restart their Round Table attended by 19 prospective Members.
- Membership advice to several Round Tables e.g. Inverurie, Heswall, Brighouse, Bournemouth.
- Support Round Table by attending Agri Games, pool, cricket, casinos, event parking, business meetings etc. etc. for various local Round Tables.
- Attend and speak at Round Table National Meetings to show support for them and ask for help to getting members for 41 Club.
- Attend Four Club Family meeting aimed at improving links between the Clubs and membership.
- Hosting the second event (clay pigeon shooting) for Wrexham Round Table at which we got the names of 15 potential Members.
- Attending local and Regional 41 Club events.
- Help Deeside 41 Club to run their first beer festival.
- Support from Deeside for another 41 Club (Deeside Inbetweeners).
- Resistance from Middlewich to another 41 Club (Middlewich Inbetweeners).
- Gave advice to several 41 Clubs on the consequence of disaffiliation.
- Attend the Round Table National Sporting Weekend to promote 41 Club membership and our NSSW in Norfolk. Also asked to speak to various Clubs about help and support for membership.
- Written articles for the 41 Club Members Facebook page and magazine.
- Liaison with local 41 Clubs to see what they can do to help their Round Tables.
- Advice on 41 Club sales.
- Attend the Four Club Family Night in Ellesmere Port run by Richie Minshall. Advice on honorary life membership.
- New Member Enquiries as summarised below.
- Affiliations and Disaffiliations and liaison with the relevant National Councillor as summarised below.
- Notified Okehampton about the creation of another 41 Club in Okehampton but some Members objected and didn't like them being called "active". The majority of the Club were okay with it as they want to be a dining Club and are happy for a new more active Club to be created.
- Contact with Round Table National Board and especially the Membership Officer Paul Bewley.



- Involved with outstanding capitations for 2017 and 2018. This could be a barometer for struggling Clubs.
- There have been too many 41 Club disaffiliations recently so I would like to discuss communication and retention with the National Council.
- Use banners and the new 41 Club leaflets to promote our events and free membership for Members aged 40-45
- Membership Committee need to look at how we can best support struggling Tables and restart some that have closed.
- Round Table will shortly announce a new wave of "Discover Round Table" activities aimed at struggling Clubs. I have agreed to use £750 of my budget to help with those activities. This has been very well received by the Round Table National Council and is a great way of demonstrating our continued support for them. I strongly believe that a stronger Round Table and good link between Table and 41 Club will lead to a stronger 41 Club.

Round Table Membership

There are 3,345 members at present and have recruited 267 so far this year. Nearly 50% of all new Members are aged 26-35 and this matches their market engagement data and where they want to focus their attention.

Retiring Tablers

Because of GDPR I have been unable to access a list of those recently retired so that this can be sent to all 41 Club National Councillors....but our friends on the Round Table National Board have given me a solution. I have written a generic letter which is to be sent by Round Table to all retiring Tablers.

Only 25% of retiring Tablers join 41 Clubs so we need to look at how to improve links and make ourselves the Club of choice.

Web Enquiries

I have received 9 enquiries since the NCM in Aberdeen through the web site from ex Tablers who are looking to join 41 Club but needed help contacting their nearest Club.

Newsletter / Magazine

The October 2018 issue of the newsletter has been sent out, so I'll be following up with the November 2018 and subsequent editions.

Press Awards

The Winter 2018 magazine includes a notice of the annual photographic competition opening. The format will be much as it has been for the past three years except that this year's competition will be a joint 41 Club and Tangent competition. The issue preventing us from doing this before was the question of distribution of profits from sales of the calendars between the 41 Club and Tangent Presidents' charities. This problem is resolved for the year 2019-2020 with Presidents Elect Sue Hill and Andrew Mackereth choosing the same charity for their year.

The November 2018 newsletter will also contain this notice, as well as notice of the competitions for the David Hewitt and David Smith Awards opening. Entries for all competitions will be accepted until the evening of February 14th 2019. On-line voting for the photographic competition will be open to both 41 Club and Tangent members until 9:00am on the morning of the National AGM of 41 Club. The winners of all competitions will be announced as usual during the AGM.

I'm sorry to report that 20% of the 2019 calendars have gone missing. Five boxes of 60 calendars were sent to Aberdeen from Landor Print. Only four made it to the meeting room on the Saturday. This means one of two possibilities: either the courier service only delivered four boxes or the hotel lost one. Either way round, it means that the Association has spent \mathfrak{L}_{120} on calendars that it never saw and it means \mathfrak{L}_{300} of lost revenue that would have gone to President Phill's charity.

To those of you who have taken calendars from me, please bring the proceeds from those that you have sold to Hull so that I can group payments into the 41 Club account.

Website

The Scottish Regions 1 and 2 have recently been reorganised so that the division between them is no longer East/West but North/South now. Any changes that needed to be made in the Club Administration System have been made but with the link between CAS and the website not being established, these changes had to be made manually to the website. Furthermore, since this is one of the many aspects of the website over which we have little to no control, we had to ask Toucan Internet to intervene. Toucan Internet has moved the Clubs to their new Regions as appropriate but the names of those Regions are hard-coded and have yet to be changed. This has been raised with Toucan.

With everyone's eyes on the maps of Regions and the Clubs within them, this has raised another issue. Our provider of maps services, Google, now requires that all production sites using these services create accounts with Google so that usage of the services can be tracked. Without this, Google serves up a greyed out version of the map with a notice saying that the visitor is viewing a development version of the service. We therefore have several options open to us:

1. Remove the map from the "Clubs & Regions" page: It would still be possible to run a search for a Club and to see the Clubs within a given Region. Clubs would simply no

longer be visible on a map. Considerable time and effort was, however, put into defining the latitude and longitude of each Club specifically for inclusion on a map; that information was not readily available in CAS at the time.

- 2. Remove the "Clubs & Regions" page altogether: When new Clubs are created in CAS, that information was originally meant to ripple through to the website in daily imports via the API bridge. This does not happen, so we have to create Clubs manually on the website. This does not allow us to place new Clubs in any specific Region, which in turn means that Clubs created over the past few years are not visible in searches and therefore don't show on the "Clubs & Regions" page. The information presented on the page is therefore out of date anyway.
- 3. Set up a Google account for 41 Club: This will resolve the issue of the map being greyed out. Google will want payment details for the service, although they do give account holders a monthly credit of US\$200 for maps services that should more than cover the level of usage that visitors to the website will incur. There shouldn't be a cost implication other than for alterations to the "Clubs & Regions" page to use the new account if we go down this route.
- 4. Set up a Google account and ask Toucan for the ability to set a Club's Region: The previous option does not allow us to keep the "Clubs & Regions" page up to date. Short of fixing the API Bridge (cost approx.... £5k-£6k) we will not be able to do so unless we ask Toucan to add a feature to the website whereby we can list Clubs by Region, including those that are not yet in a Region, and edit the Region in a Club's details. I'm asking Toucan for a quote for this and will report back in the Board/Council meetings.

My recommendation would be option 4. It's a member who drew our attention to a problem with the map, so the page is being used. Placing a Club's meeting point on a map is also useful for potential members trying to locate a Club near to them, so I would recommend against removing the map or the page anyway, which means that we need a means to keep it up to date. Fixing the API bridge is a costly venture and possibly a waste of money with the precise form of the update to CAS still to be defined and the very existence of a link between CAS and the website moving forward still up for debate. Option 4 allows us to keep the map and to ensure information is kept up to date whether there is a link to CAS in the future or not.

As for other general usability issues with the website, it is my intention to meet with Webmaster Ray in November if possible to run through them, prioritise them and send those that have most impact to Toucan to address them.

CAS

After the June Council meeting in Aberdeen I purchased a new computer and started work on the rewrite of CAS according to the Operational Spec. provided in January and the Technical Spec. provided in April. I hadn't been given the green light at that point but wanted to give myself the best chance possible of meeting the then deadline of this Half Yearly Council meeting in the event I did get the job.





The back-end is mostly written and I had succeeded in importing the current Club and membership information while grouping members of more than one Club (currently appearing in the database as many times as Clubs that they belong to) into single members holding more than one membership. This also highlighted several Clubs in which the same member appeared more than once (I fixed this while working on the importer). My next step was going to be to approach Mike Gibbs and ask for access to the Club Officer information and to financial information.

The President and Vice-President, however, asked me to put this work on the back burner while further options are being sought and considered, which has freed me up to resume work on the newsletter and magazine.

Office365

No major problems to report. The only minor issues encountered boil down to users forgetting their passwords.

The highly convoluted and confusing directory structure within SharePoint remains to be addressed. I did request access with sufficient privileges to do this from Mike Gibbs but never did obtain it and haven't had time to follow up on this until now.

Point for consideration: if we go with the recommended option for the resolution of the map issue on the website, we will have an account with Google that we could use to trial their services as a replacement for Office365. It's true that one of the reasons prompting my suggestion of this option 3 years ago was the cost, and that is no longer an issue since Technos switched us to a lower cost plan. Google Apps are, however, more intuitive to use and provide an interface that's already familiar to a significant number of users (many of us have Gmail accounts, for example). This said, the Microsoft interface doesn't present any difficulties that can't be resolved with training (more on that later).

GDPR

I'll just give some top-level figures here. Region 5 National Councillor has shepherded this project and will give a more detailed report.

As of Oct. 11th 2018, just shy of 2000 paper consent forms have been received. Roughly 1200 have been received in electronic form, so that's about 3200 out of 15400 members, so about 21%.

Much of the membership still does not understand why we are doing this and believe that by accepting to be a member of a 41 Club that is consent enough. Some Clubs have self-proclaimed experts as members who are providing information that conflicts with ours (obtained from someone who works closely with the Information Commissioner's Office), so there is also some confusion, not to mention the parochial nature of many Clubs leading them to give more credence to their own member's (often inaccurate) information than to that coming from National.

Training





This is something that needs to be provided every year, preferably early on in the year (before or around the June Council meeting), so that new members of Council can be brought up to speed on our IT systems and become more efficient sooner.

Currently we have a day's training once or maybe twice a year. This is NOWHERE near enough. It might just about be enough if trainees had a firm enough grasp of the basics of what a website is and does, how to copy and paste information, how to log in to a website, how to attach files to an e-mail and what a file is in the first place, but a large proportion of them don't have these basic skills. Then there are the specific idiosyncrasies of each of the systems that we use that need covering.

In my opinion, the training session for new Council members should be a three-day session with the first day devoted to basic IT skills. For the remaining two days, we can assume those basic IT skills to be acquired and concentrate more on the specifics of our own systems. There should also be a refresher session of half a day held halfway through the year. This session could potentially be combined with the Half Yearly Council weekend

It only seems like yesterday that I was writing my first National Fellowship Officer report and there has been no let up for myself or the fellowship team during the summer months. My report is broken down into the key areas of the role as follows:

National Council meetings





National Board & Council Meeting

Saturday 27th October 2018 The Village Hotel, Hessle, Nr Hull, HU4 7DY

The June Council meeting will occur on the weekend of $28^{th} - 30^{th}$ June in either the Berkshire/Buckinghamshire or Hertfordshire area. Hotels details will be forwarded once confirmed. The October meeting will be held on the Isle of Man over the weekend of $11^{th} - 13^{th}$ October at the palace hotel. Details of how to book will be forwarded in due course.

Presidential car and New Affinity deal

Following the last Board meeting where it was agreed to proceed with a new affinity deal with Peugeot/Citroen/DS group. I am recommending to Council that we relook at the deal because the President loaned a car for a week and after returning the car we were issued with a bill of over £250 for damage to the windscreen, despite the person who checked the car thoroughly saying that everything was OK. This bill was disputed and the manufacturer subsequently agreed to cancel the invoice. As members will know this is becoming a common theme with leasing companies and I am concerned that if we agree to this affinity deal in 2/3 years' time, when cars are returned, our members may incur significant penalties and we will receive a number of complaints as a result. I have asked (and received) a copy of the company's policy on returning cars and I would ask that Council agree that we do not agree to the affinity deal and I will seek an alternative.

Members Benefits

Since our last NC meeting we have agreed a new benefit for our members with the Hilton hotel group. There has been some misuse in relation to the Wider Wallet discount codes and, as a result, members will now have to write to Andy Ventress to get a code and we will no longer publish the code in the magazine. Andy is also working on a new insurance deal and hopefully will be able to report on progress in Hull.

Classic rally

Shirley Late Knights have agreed to arrange the 2019 rally which will take place in the Cotswolds on the weekend of $14^{th} - 16^{th}$ June. Guests will be staying in the Essington Chase Spa Hotel. I have been asking if there are any issues from the Clubs, and mostly, they are that they don't understand GDPR, and that they are either going to be closing the Club, or where they have feeder Clubs, that they will be becoming smaller as the membership isn't coming through. There is a resignation to this fate for some, but for others, a real determination to support their Table and to build stronger relationships.

I have asked Clubs to consider a Chair & Vice Chair event – this has been through meetings and through the newsletters I send and if the response is positive, I will start one next year to get them all together and to share ideas. With their permission, I will also invite other Club Chairs/Vice Chairs so that everyone can get to know each other and build great relationships.

Membership

Whilst writing this report it is a year today since the Area 16 Kent RT 80th Charter Ball. But despite a huge amount of communication (emails/phone calls/Facebook etc.) the event was supported by only x13 Members and their guests from x4 41 Clubs from the County.

This lack of visibility by 41 Club provoked a joint strategy by the Region 18 RT and Region 25 41 Club National Councillors to get together and develop a strategy to organise joint events. Its early days and hopefully the ball is starting to roll with more 41 Clubs getting involved.

As I attend the RT events and meetings to date it's clear to see why many members of Kent Round Tables are disillusioned with 41 Club and aren't fussed to join them. This is frankly because they never hear from 41 Clubs, don't organise joint meetings; and aren't familiar with any of the Members.

In December 2016 Ramsgate RT closed. In April this year Ramsgate 41 Club closed because they had no new Members and the average age of the Members was 70+. Younger Members of RT and remaining 41 Club Members have since organised their own Club (not affiliated to 41 Club) and started to meet and organise events. This should be noted as a warning of where our organisation is heading if we don't improve membership.

As Round Table declines in Kent, now just 9 Round Tables remain; Members of the Kent 41 Clubs will decline as they grow older and the membership will dwindle further. There's no way of knowing what the average age of the Members are in Kent, but I suspect that it is around 70.

Although progress this year is disappointingly slow we have seen some 41 Clubs get involved with their respective Table's and are now proactively organising and attending





events. My congratulations go to those 41 Clubs who are trying to reach out and help improve their feeder Round Tables.

My last thoughts on membership focus on those 41 Clubs who don't now have feeder Clubs. What are they to do? Just New Members are not appearing quickly enough and their membership is dwindling. Like it or not those Clubs are now recruiting new Members who have not previously been in Round Table. This National Association needs to review the current membership rules and procedures and improve them regarding these Clubs.

GDPR

The attitude towards the new GDPR rules in my view will be an issue for many Clubs. Recently I was asked for the contact details of some 41 Clubs and I had to refuse to give them because the GDPR access forms have not been completed. I'm hoping that 41 Clubs will see this and organise request forms or they may lose valuable contact information and new Member opportunities.

I must apologise for what appears to be a dreary and negative report. Actions taken includes the +1 new Members initiative, as well as joint events to improve Club diaries.
