NATIONAL SECRETARY - SEAN McCORMICK

Well, National AGM Torquay is definitely dominating my life at the moment. The mad panic of preparing Agenda, Report, circulating Notice & Minutes is at last behind me & although I circulated the paper on the website on time, some 'eagle-eyed' amongst you spotted some errors that meant I didn't get the usual email out until the day after, some 14 hours late.

I would like again to provide my sincere thanks to Hugh Milward (our National Honorary Archivist) for his volunteering to run the slide show at the AGM. This is one small worry that has been removed from my shoulders. As always, we need willing hands, so if there are any other volunteers for registration, for instance, please let yourself be known.

a. Progress on your key objectives.

<u>Documentation</u> – Hopefully, you will have all seen/noticed that all our reports and minutes are updated & uploaded to the National Website. Please refer to the Secretary's page and look for the Section about National Council Reports and Minutes. We are currently holding more than 3 years' worth of Reports & Minutes, I am not sure if we need to go back that far, but if no one says anything I am inclined to leave it that way. I have not been also putting all the reports, minutes, etc on Sharepoint, it is a question I raised last year that I have not really had a satisfactory answer to. I have found Sharepoint invaluable in finding documents that I need, for instance the Proxy forms, Job Descriptions, policies, etc, but I suspect I am one of the very few. I also happen to know that some (our Comms & IT Officer to name just one), happen to actively dislike it. Is it still viable if we are not really using it?. What is the cost difference between just the Office 365 email & the whole package?. Just putting the guestion out there.

Canvassing – I refer to National Rule 6.6 "Canvassing for support of nominations for office is prohibited...... The National Council shall decide if any prohibited canvassing has taken place in which event that candidate shall be disqualified from that election." Yet again I seem to have become embroiled in more instances of potential canvassing. This time it would appear to be much more centered around the manipulation of the proxy vote as opposed to Social Media (Facebook, Twitter, etc). This is a horrible thing to have to decide & would appear to be rife amongst one specific region. I have been tasked to get together a little team (along with VP Andrew & David Smith, our National Honorary Solicitor) and investigate whether canvassing & seeking proxy votes has been occurring & if there is any ground for doubt, bring it to yourselves for a decision. I am obviously hoping that for all involved I will need to say nothing on Friday.

Registration for voting at National AGM – This is for both attending clubs as well as proxies. Whilst this is a repeat of my note from last year, it bears up to re-telling. It

has been interesting, whilst I have been receiving registration documents for votes (particularly proxies) I undertaken three checks that I thought fundamental.

- 1) That the club giving the proxy, as well as the club receiving the proxy, are up to date in their payment of subs. If they are not, I refuse to take the proxy until it is paid.
- 2) That the person named to carry the vote, is a registered member. This has led to some interesting correspondence with individuals who believed themselves to be members, but are not on CAS. This has become particularly prevalent for those that have asked their details to be removed because of GDPR. Yes, you might be a member & your club declare & pay for you, but if your details do not appear, I cannot give you a vote. Certainly something to think upon for the future.
- 3) That the person signing the form is in the correct office/position according to CAS. Again, this is just a tidy up, but essentially if they sign off as a Secretary, Chairman, Club Contact, etc, that this is actually recorded correctly on CAS. If I find a difference, I check & then sort things out for them. Time consuming, but I believe necessary.

b. Progress on action points from the previous meetings

<u>AGM</u> – At the time of writing I have received one counter-proposal, or amendment to a Resolution submitted.

This is to do with the moving of Marchesi House. The amendment to Resolution 1 is as follows:-

Moving Marchesi House to Belfast, Northern Ireland, as they have a large white public building called 'Stormont' that currently lies vacant & is ready for immediate use.

There are many regular and varied flights from many parts of the UK and depending on the 'back stop' and which deal, or no-deal, we get could have easy access to and from the republic of Ireland.

If, however, there are thoughts that Belfast might not be a suitable venue & you would rather have a headquarters in Europe, then the suggestion is Dublin, where we shall purchase a suitable room within the Guinness Brewery. All work could be done in a harmonious atmosphere, with quick adjournments to Templebar to replenish our glasses.

The proposal is from Dublin 41 Club Seconded by Bangor 41 Club

There were no other changes or corrections required of the documentation circulated regarding Torquay AGM. Nor corrections to the Minutes circulated, I'll not hold my breath, but currently it is looking good.

c. Your activity during the period

All as above plus:-

I have been out & about and covered for President Phill whilst he was ill at Southend (now Chelmsford) Cluster meet, Norwich Forecast Meet, Brentwood, CLIT, OBEs amongst others, but won't bore you all with all the details. I am also seeing my calendar start to fill up throughout the year & look forward to seeing you all on my travels.

Standing Orders for Clubs – I have been getting a lot of correspondence/telephone calls regarding AGM's & how clubs are meant to run them, particularly if an issue or contentious subject is being brought up. Although our National Rules cover a few of the major points, these should really be bought into conjunction with a clubs own Standing Orders. Very many of the clubs I have spoken to, can't remember if or when, they last saw or reviewed their Standing Orders. We publish (under my section of the website) a rough guideline of Standing Orders that clubs can adapt to their own needs. These can cover clubs if they get 'sticky' issues such as Honorary Memberships, what Officers they need (outside Sec, Chairman & Treasurer), how you make up your diary, venues, etc. Really anything you might want, or need, your club to be. I really strongly recommend that if you as a Club do not have these (or remember their content), then set yourselves up some & use our draft as a guideline. It could get you out of so much trouble.

d. Any recommendation you are making to move us in the right direction.

I am still happy in recommending adhering to the sound Strategy/Plan for 2018 – 2021 that grows the Association and keeps it interested, interesting, alive and growing.

e. Any recommendation requiring cost should be costed so we can review it and where appropriate approve it before taking it to Council.

I haven't got any, but we'll continue to keep a close eye on how things are developing with RTBI and the administration of Marchesi House. Just in case if push comes to shove & RTBI decide to outsource staff & services (we obviously hope not, but worst case, we have to think ahead).

NATIONAL TREASURER – DAVID LEACH

My report is a slightly modified version of the AGM report.

You will have seen the Income & Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet for 41 Club for the year ended 31 December 2018 together with the Cashflow Statement and proposed Budget for the year ending 2020. You will recall from the AGM held in Belfast in 2018 that the 2019 budget has already been approved.

Income & Expenditure Account

<u>Income</u>

Similarly to last year, effectively, capitation for 2018 represents cash banked in the year.

I have provided every National Councillor with an up-to-date position showing those Clubs in arrears of capitation in their Region and I am grateful for their efforts in chasing those that have yet to pay.

Expenditure

Administration: We continue to receive excellent service from the team at Marchesi House under the terms of our service agreement with them.

IT Systems: This includes the software licences for Microsoft Office 365, the Hosted Virtual Private Network and services to support the website.

Presidential expenses: Both Home and International are well under budget. See "Ceremonials" below.

41 International subscription: There is a true-up of the cost this year, which is not expected to recur, having now received the invoice for the current year.

Ceremonials: This is a new line to separate out attendance by those representing our organisation at the Cenotaph, Arboretum and other events, rather than including it within Presidential expenses.

Membership database: This is another new line to record expenditure to ensure that our database is up-to-date, as accurate and complete as possible and is fully compliant with regulations.

Magazine printing: There was a modest overspend on this line due to there being three full issues including one bumper edition in the year.

Council meetings: This has been rather an exceptional year in respect of the geographical location of the meetings. The ones in Belfast and Aberdeen led to a somewhat higher than previous element relating to travel.

Depreciation: This is lower than budgeted as we have not yet committed to any capital expenditure on new IT Systems (e.g. CAS2).

Balance Sheet

Fixed assets: All previously capitalised expenditure on IT systems is now fully depreciated.

Debtors: These include prepayments of expenditure relating to future National Conferences and other events.

Cash at bank: We now hold just over 100% of expenditure (based on 2018) in cash reserves.

Creditors: These include the accrual for 41 International fees, Audit fee and the administration fee relating to the month of December 2018 which was received after the end of the year.

At the 2015 AGM a Resolution to set the Reserves at a minimum of six months, with a recommendation of 100%, of the Annual Total Expenditure of the Association was carried. As at the year-end, cash reserves were £195k and the total expenditure was £193k. Most of the cash reserves are held on a 32 day savings account with Bank of Scotland earning base rate plus 7 basis points.

The surpluses made in 2017 and 2018 may be invested in improvements in our IT infrastructure starting in 2019 (e.g. an updated version of the membership database "CAS" and changes to the website). This would impact on the depreciation charge in future years.

Budget 2020

Capitation will remain at £14.50.

I have included in a new line called "Membership database" an amount for software licences should we choose to go down the route of paying a licence fee to use an existing system, rather than create our own. I emphasise that this does not indicate a preference for that route or that a decision has yet been made. If we do choose to build our own system, this expenditure line will effectively drop down into "Depreciation" instead.

Expenditure on "Club Visits" has historically been under budget, however, it is anticipated that the Board will make more visits themselves in order to deliver certain aspects of the strategic plan.

The last three years have seen us report surpluses of income over expenditure. I am presenting here a deficit budget. Although we are not a profit-making organisation, it is right and proper to maintain health cash reserves for unforeseen circumstances. However, we should incur expenditure where it delivers value-for-money for the membership and seeks to secure the future of our great movement.

If you would like me to clarify any items, please contact me in advance of the AGM and I will do my best to answer.

Budget 2019

In the Appendix attached, I show the split of the budget between Quarter 1 and the remainder of the year. This is to draw your attention to the fact that some roles change at the

AGM and it is desirable to ensure that expenditure it not only capped across the whole year, but also by role-holders within the year.

You will note that the Budget for 2019 contained an additional amount specifically to reflect the geographical location of the current President – hence the "President exp - home" is not split 25:75.

ACTING NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP & ROUND TABLE LIASON OFFICER – GLEN LYON

Since February I have been kept quite busy resolving the several issues I was handed at Potters, here is the update on some of them:

Disputes -

Dundee 41 Club about the name of Dundee City Active 41 Club, having met with both Clubs (on separate days in separate locations) with their National Councillor Kevin I believe we have resolved the situation to the if not satisfaction at least the acquiescence of both parties.

Redditch 41 Club about the name of Redditch & Studley 41 Club has been far more challenging to deal with initially it appeared a simple case, however as I investigated further some surprising evidence appeared. A brief and potted history is:

Some Members of Redditch Round Table did not like the way the Club was being run and separately there was a falling out of wives around a new Ladies Circle group.

Several of the unhappy Members left the Club and joined Alcester Round Table

These individuals retired and looked to start up a Redditch 41 Club a few years ago.

There was an existing 41 Club in Redditch, but it disaffiliated many years ago – still meets up regularly and calls themselves Redditch 41 Club. They refused the new Clubs request for the regalia.

The 2 main driving forces in Redditch Round Table have come to retirement age and looking to join the 'official' Redditch 41 Club were refused membership.

The Chairman of Redditch Round Table wrote a letter to the 'official' Redditch 41 Club stating that they did not consider their Table as the feeder to the 'official' Redditch 41 Club and this could only be resolved if the 41 Club accepted all retiring Tablers from Redditch Table not pick and choose their 'favourites'

With no 41 Club to join the retiring Tablers opted to start up their own 41 Club with the support and blessing of the Redditch Round Table.

Having spoken to the Redditch & Studley 41 Club, Redditch Round Table Chairman, Regional Rep for Table Paul Bryant, a Past Area Table Chairman (and Past Alcester RT Chair) Juan Adie, National Councillor 41 Club Region 15 Andy Ventress and Members of the 'official' Redditch Club Lee Bevan & Barry Durman. I believe that there is no charge to answer as the conurbation of Redditch has a population in excess of 85,000 there is more than enough room for two 41 Clubs perhaps the biggest question is what is the 'official' 41 Club's plans for encouraging new Members as they have no feeder Club?

I have requested a meeting with the 'official' Redditch 41 Club, to date they have not responded with a proposed date.

I do not believe we can or should retain the affiliation package for Redditch & Studley any longer and allow them to get up and running properly.

Okehampton/Okehampton & District – I have left this one at arm's length as Mark appears to be on the case with Graham and Godwin due to a spelling error on CAS.

Affiliations – held over from Potters meeting:

Wolverhampton West 41 Club – I had the pleasure of attending a meeting of the existing Wolverhampton 41 Club and they are giving their unanimous support to the new Club being formed. They are also looking at engaging with other ex Tablers in their vicinity and rise to the challenge of adding one additional Member before 2020.

Alpha Knights – Having discussed with Des about the raison d'etre of this Club we have agreed that it should be registered at Marchesi House, Andy Ventress has been advised of the proposal and is in agreement with the registration being in Region 15.

New Clubs In the pipeline

Crieff 41 Club – I am attending an inaugural meeting on 17th May with a plan to Charter for October meeting.

We are also looking at assisting in the start up of new Tables in Weymouth and Droitwich Spa – more details to follow as these projects progress.

Disaffiliations

Princes Risborough – Region 19 – Only 8 members on CAS, Bernard Elwen has been liaising & they are unanimous in wanting to disaffiliate

Newcastle upon Tyne - Region 4 – struggling to get more than 4 members to turn up to a meeting

North Norfolk 41 Club – Region 17 – effectively closed 3-4 years ago. Ex Members go to Holt 41 Club.

Ruislip – held what was by all accounts an excellent and well attended evening to 'celebrate' the closing of the club. – These are the Clubs we need to be talking to about flexible formats as they get to a certain age that they feel they cannot carry on meeting monthly then why not look at meeting 1-2-3 times a year our motto is "continued Friendship" and that is what we should be providing these ex Tablers.

We truly need to adapt and improve the practices we have adopted which may have worked 10 - 20 - 30 years ago but these Members are now those many years older too and we need to take account of this.

I have a couple of AGM's which I shall be attending where individual Members have been concerned enough by talk of proposals to disaffiliate that they have contacted us to discuss what can be done so I will attend and discuss with them the benefits of staying within the Association.

Initiatives:

Vision 2020 – quite simply we want to challenge all the Clubs out there to add 1 new member before 1st January 2020. We know there are a lot (between 5,000 and 9,000) of men out there who were once in Round Table but for what ever reason they did not 'migrate' over to 41 Club we also know the age rule change created a huge age divide between retiring Tablers and existing 41 Clubs. But from my own Clubs experience (we have just inducted 5 new Members at our A.G.M. on Tuesday only one of which was a retiring Tabler from our feeder Club) A lot of those guys have moved about changed locations and looked in the mirror and realised they are that bloke who was in their 41 Club and they would like to reengage with past Tablers but do not know where we are so we need to be more visible to the general public so these 'lost' blokes know where to find us.

We will be launching "Ye Olde Round Tabler" pop up lounge at fetes, festivals and fayres this year basically a gazebo with comfortable chairs and a small refreshment with branding outside and optional wheel of fortune game to attract attention. This will hopefully allow us to engage in conversation with visitors, harvest information and point them in the direction of their local 41 Club.

We had a spike in the number of online enquiries (okay 6 as opposed to 1 or none as usual) the week of the 41 Club guys being on Eggheads including 1 who has already attended his first meeting.

We are also looking at collectors' pins for recruitment of new Members to 41 Club and a bottle of finest malt whisky for the Club with the biggest increase in numbers by 1st Jan 2020 and a bottle of Port to the Club with the best membership initiative in each magazine.

Electronic copies since the formation of 41 Club are available in the SharePoint archive up till 1985 under the heading "Proceedings", plus a set from June 1993 to Feb 2002. All other copies to date are floating about somewhere. As with the AGM minutes these need to be signed and approved copies that are archived.

Magazines

These are very useful to indicate what is happening out in the Regions and Clubs. I am pleased to report that we have scanned copies from Number 1 up till 2002 on the SharePoint Archive. There are also magazines from winter 2012 to date on our Website but not on SharePoint.

There is a hard copy of all Magazines from Number 1 to the current date in the 41 Club Archive Room at Marchesi House.

Newsletter

Likewise the Newsletter is an important Archive document. There is no copy of the Newsletters stored on the SharePoint Archive. Our website holds copies from Number 46, January 2014 to the present day. I hold copies on my personal computer from Number 29 onwards.

As to Charter dates (one of the main requests the Archivist gets) these do not appear to be held anywhere. Recently when a new Club has been chartered a Certificate is now issued. The Membership Officer has been sending me a copy which is being held on my personal computer.

General Correspondence

All hard copy correspondence between Clubs, Regions and other parties from and received by the Secretary are available in the SharePoint Archive up till April 1986 when electronic correspondence became the norm.

Miscellaneous Items

These can include package information that covers events such as Conference, Classic Car Rally, NSSW, and Caravan and Camping Rally amongst others. This list is growing but none are stored on SharePoint. Currently I am trying to collect hard copies for storing in the 41 Club Archive Room at Marchesi House. These items really are the Archive of the future.
