NATIONAL SECRETARY - SEAN MCCORMICK

Rule amendments regarding 6.6 (Canvassing) and 17.3 (Proxy Voting) are still being worked on as I write. However in the general correspondence appearing in the Secretarial emails it is becoming apparent that more & more clubs are becoming interested in our rules and changing, correcting and amending same. I will give you a flavour of some of the items to be discussed at our meeting:-

Rule 21 Annual Conferences & Regional Rallies – Steve James is the lead on this. He has managed to get Tangent to agree to the sharing of costs (& profit/loss) of our National Conference & events where the two of our Associations hold responsibility. We need to tidy up the rule so that this change in responsibility is fairly reflected within our rules.

Rule 4 Affiliation & Membership – As some of you may have been aware following Facebook discussion on the subject, within Mark House's Region 18, there has been some discussion regarding memberships & capitation. The core of this would appear to be to change the need for individuals to pay more than one capitation fee, regardless of the number of clubs in which you belong. This would, in effect, change our membership from being Clubs, to individuals. There could be two ways of looking at this, yes, change our Association to one of members. This has been investigated before, but never changed due to the inability of CAS being able to handle this, perhaps in light of a new Database, this could now become a possibility. The other option that is being mooted by Region 18, is to provide an addition to the rule that provides a clarification to payment of capitation fees. The suggestion would be an addition to our current rule that reads as follows:-

"For the avoidance of doubt, an affiliated club shall not pay annual capitation fees to the Association for a member if that member's annual capitation fees are paid to the Association by another affiliated club. The onus is on the member to ensure that their annual capitation fees, if due, are paid to the Association once and in full. An individual shall not be a member of any affiliated club unless their annual capitation fees, if due, are paid to the Association once and in full."

It is an interesting issue & one which either myself or Mark House will be bringing before Council in the meeting. At the moment this is being pitched to us as a discussion topic, but I suspect that it will become a resolution, in reality, if we do not grasp 'the nettle'.

One of the other items of interest came from Wynn Parry (NC Region 6) regarding clubs who have disaffiliated, but still continue to banner themselves as 41 Club, wear our badges & regalia, etc. What do we do about this?, an interesting subject. We have just renewed our trademarks, this gives us sole rights as to the name 'Association of ex-Round Tablers', the 41 Club and our rondel. I do not know of any case where we have actually taken a legal route regarding usage of our Association without permission. I know from my experience in

Roundtable, that the closest it gets is strongly worded letters to the offenders (mostly manufacturers/distributors of regalia, clothing, etc) and that normally works. Perhaps Council would like myself or David Smith to draft a suitable letter that could be used by a local club if they know of individuals/clubs where our name is being banded without permission?. I welcome suggestions & debate on the subject.

I will also bring up the subject of AGM and how you bring Resolutions, Rule changes, etc to the meeting.

NATIONAL TREASURER - DAVID LEACH

This report should be read together with the draft Income & Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet for 41 Club to 30 Sep 2019.

Cash Reserves

At the 2015 AGM a resolution was carried to set the reserves at a minimum of six months, with a recommendation of 100%, of the Annual Total Expenditure of the Association. The Club has £140k in Barclays and £100k in the RBS interest bearing accounts. We are currently working on a replacement administration system and the financial outcome of this is still uncertain. Thanks to the efforts of the National Councillors, especially Graham Sloan, we have collected over 94% of the capitation for the calendar year 2019. Although we still have one more quarter's overheads to incur, we will end the year in very good shape.

It may be the case that the amount of cash reserves held will raise questions from the floor at the AGM as to whether we should be considering a reduction in the per capita charge to Members in the future. It is always much easier to reduce capitation than it is to raise it, especially given the rule that caps any increase to 50 pence per year. I would welcome debate at the Council Meeting as to your thoughts on how best to deal with such questions.

Income & Expenditure Account

Income: Capitation for 2019 represents cash banked in the year.

Expenditure

IT Systems: This includes the software licences for Microsoft Office 365, the Hosted Virtual Private Network and services to support the website.

Presidential expenses: Both Home and International are on track to remain within budget. See "Ceremonials" below.

41 International subscription: The true-up of the cost last year is not expected to recur, however the invoice for the current year is not usually received until much later in the year.

Ceremonials: This is a new line that was introduced last year to separate out attendance by those representing our organisation at the Cenotaph, Arboretum and other events, rather than including it within Presidential expenses. There have sadly been too many funerals this year.

Membership database: This was another new line last year to record expenditure to ensure that our database is up-to-date, as accurate and complete as possible and is fully compliant with regulations. So far this year, there has not been any expenditure on this line, and there is no budget.

Gifts and Awards: This figure includes medal stock usage.

Depreciation: This is lower than budgeted as we have not yet committed to any capital expenditure on new IT Systems (e.g. CAS2).

Balance Sheet

Fixed assets: All previously capitalised expenditure on IT systems is now fully depreciated.

Debtors: These include prepayments of expenditure relating to future National Conferences and other events.

Creditors: These include the accrual for 41 International and Independent Examiner's fees.

NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP & ROUND TABLE LIASON OFFICER - GLEN LYON (CARETAKER)

Retention, Recruitment and assisting Round Table in their Revival

We are looking forward today to 3 new affiliations and 1 re-affiliation.

As I mentioned at our last meeting, we are endeavouring to make something of the new Club charters (and re-charters too) aiming to get local press coverage and keep getting the good news out there to those Ex-Tablers who haven't yet joined a Club.

Along with National President Andrew, we attended the charter meeting of Crieff 41 Club, the evening was an immensely enjoyable one with a dozen guys having a go on a 14 ton digger and little Kubota lifting metal components on and off posts then followed a barbeque and we got down to inducting the new Members, presenting their framed charter certificate along with a bottle of single malt (collected from the Aberfeldy distillery, many thanks to Ross and the team at the distillery who managed an amazing 'better than trade' price to help us in our membership campaign) to toast the new Club..

We were then on the Sunday in Callander to participate in the Callander Highland Games and we marched through the town in our bright yellow Callander 41 Club shirts accompanied by pipe bands and what felt like 2/3rds of the town to the field where the games took place Andrew made the presentation of their charter on the tartan games podium.

We have several more of these chartering events including Edinburgh on St. Andrews Night and Chepstow in February along with the new Clubs seeking approval to join this month and our re-affiliating Clubs too.

We still have a Vision 2020 where every Club is challenged to add +1 Member to its CAS list before the 1st January. Part of this project is to persuade our Clubs with no feeder table to reach out into Ex-Tablers in their local community who have not yet joined their local Club. Several Clubs are adding double figures to their memberships, lots of good work going on out there

RE-Affiliations:

We are currently targeting/working on 3 more affiliations and 6+ more re-affiliations this year.

Disaffiliations:

List on separate paperwork to be issued on the day due to ongoing discussions

We must be given the opportunity to address them before they vote on it as once the decision is made it becomes an issue of 'saving face' not to overturn a bad decision. As an example of the 4 Clubs who contacted us about the very likely disaffiliation of their Club (either Club Officers requesting information on due process or concerned general members looking for support to keep the Club going) I visited them and not one of those Clubs disaffiliated indeed one of them has come back to us and requested information in how they can help RTBI restart a Table in their town.

Please let me know before the Club has closed as we can do something about it at that point if it's too late it is gone and a whole lot harder to restart a Club from scratch than keep one going.

Family membership badges:

I met up with the other Membership Officers from the other parts of the Round Table Family at both the RTBI Conference in Leicester and again in Birmingham at the Four Family meeting we had the opportunity to look at the new membership badges and on speaking to the respective National Presidents I have drafted a letter which will be signed by them and sent along with the badge to the Club where the new Member is being inducted so it can be presented to the individual who introduced them to the Club. The badge is not just for introducing to your own Club but can be a parent who introduces their son/daughter to Table/Circle, and Members who introduce friends and acquaintances to one of the family Clubs.

There will be an online application form in each of the Association's information sections for Clubs to apply for the badge and thank you letter.

Plan B for the elephant in the room:

From last meeting:

Membership of RTBI taking current figure provided at 3,825, assuming a retirement of 10% and that we converted 100% - (I know all three are less than plausible but bear with me) we

would gain 383 new 41 Club members. This is not sustainable we need to increase our membership by 3 to 4 times that as the age profile of our Clubs membership marches upwards we have 2 problems.

We have a reduced pool of Members and we will follow the 'bell curve' of membership echoing RTBI only 35 – 40 years behind so as RTBI's peak memberships were in the early 1980's, we will have a large number of Members in their mid – late 70's and early 80's which is very noticeable as you visit Clubs up and down the country.

To enable 41 Clubs to continue to grow we really have to address the concept of a <u>qualified</u> entry system which would allow clubs to convert honorary members into full members of the association.

We as part tablers have been somewhat less than successful at recruiting into Round Table – this is not an assumption the membership figures reveal in glaring detail the facts.

We now face the situation where we have let down excellent potential Tablers twice once when we did not recruit them into Table, then and again when we bar them from becoming full members of 41 Club (but to make it worse we condemn them to being second class citizens as they cannot serve the Club or represent the Club – oh yes but we will take your money (and worse several Clubs don't even pass that onto National so they aren't even receiving magazines, newsletters (unless second hand) or more importantly insurance!

This has to stop this year – I have a file bulging with excellent candidates one who served us as an active soldier and then went on to become a sergeant in the police, he has retired at 50 relocated with his wife to a new area and has asked if he can join 41 Club because he understands he is too old for Round Table but has had only good experiences with Tablers and the work they do for their community.

We have several Clubs willing to propose, second and vote in favour at 2020 AGM that Association Rule 4.2.1 should be added:

A potential new 41 Club member, not having previously been a full member of a Round Table, must serve 2 years as an honorary member of a 41 Club or 1 year as an honorary member of a Round Table to be eligible to apply for full membership of a 41 Club.

Plan B:

I have been in conversation with senior members of the Rotary Great Britain & Ireland to offer the opportunity to 'reconnect' their ex RTBI Members with old friends now in 41 Club and give them the ability to participate in continued friendship.

The charity calendars, which this year are joint with Tangent and in aid of RNLI, are currently being printed and should be available for distribution at the Isle of Man. It has been an extremely busy time since our meeting in Newbury with all National 41 Club events occurring during the summer months. My report is structured as per my areas of responsibility as follows:

Cardiff 2020

At the time of writing this report the Thursday evening function is sold out, there are only 43 spaces left for the President's banquet on the Friday evening and 115 spaces left for the Saturday fancy dress party (the venue has a larger capacity compared to Friday). As this is the first time a 41 Club and Tangent conference has been held in South Wales a Welsh themed welcome party has been arranged for the Thursday evening and meals for the conference functions feature locally sourced Welsh produce. The team have arranged a fantastic programme of events and I am sure delegates will not be disappointed.

Aviemore 2021

Arrangements for 2021 are well underway and are going according to plan. The pin badges have arrived following National Council approving the logo in June and all contracts have been signed by the association. The AGM and conference will be held over the weekend of 15th -18th April.
