There is likely to be a trial run later on in the year, so you can expect to be invited to a "dummy run" to test whatever system we come up with.

The 41 Club rules and standing orders are being reviewed and tidied up, which will mean some resolutions coming before the 2023 AGM. Again, thanks to my Admin Committee of John Kilshaw, Roger Spensley and Rory Thomsett for their input.

One of the resolutions which was passed at the AGM was that of invited membership, which has caused some reaction, particularly from those clubs who were not represented at the AGM. See the Membership Officer's report for more on this. The new members induction has been revised, to accommodate those who were ex-Tablers and those who weren't. This is on our 41Club website.

The Club Administration System (CAS) is now up and running and can be accessed by all club officers and club members from the 41 Club website. Instructions on how to do this were mailed out to all club officers several weeks ago, and I hope they found this useful.

NATIONAL MEMBERSHIP & ROUND TABLE LIASON OFFICER - PETER MCBRIDE

Since taking on the role at the AGM in Cardiff, I have been getting up to speed with the wide range of challenges, opportunities and issues that require addressing.

It is clear that the Covid pandemic over the last two years resulted in a number of Clubs reducing their meetings as well as their level of interaction within their Clubs. The gradual relaxing of restrictions across GB&I over the last 6-9 months, however, offers a good degree of encouragement for all Clubs going forward.

Current membership numbers

According to the latest CAS reports, 41 Club currently has 12,706 unique Members, of which 321 are Members of multiple Clubs.

Invitational Membership

The adoption of the Invitation Membership rule change at the Cardiff AGM allowing Clubs to invite like-minded men who are not past members of Round Table and are aged 40 and over to be regular guests at Club meetings, will also provide a real opportunity to increase membership numbers in the long term. This will take time however and we need to be sensitive to the fact that as with any large change, some Clubs will take time to consider the change to be positive one.

I have created and shared a list of FAQs regarding the rule change with all councillors. I hope they will be helpful in explaining the changes and should be used in any discussion with Clubs. They will also appear in the next National Newsletters and Magazines. The questions include:

- What membership change was introduced at this year's Cardiff AGM?
- Why was it agreed?
- What are the benefits of the rule change?
- Does my Club have to invite non-Round Tablers?
- Why did National decide on this?

The rule change was important – in that it was recognised that many men aged 40+ live very different lives now from when 41 Club was first formed 80 years ago. In recent years, there have been many and varied calls on their time, both with the increased mobility of work locations and a greater involvement in family and childcare etc... These have often meant that they did not 'discover' the Round Table family until later in life.

It was also recognised that as a consequence of relying only on ex Round Tablers, 41 Club membership would see a decline in numbers unless this was addressed.

I had anticipated that in additional to some Clubs' increasing age-profile and an annual internal apathy around the time of their AGM, we would see a small number of Clubs consider continuing. Sadly, this has been the case, with the following eight Clubs informing me of their wish to disaffiliate:

- Region 10 Sandiacre & Stapleford 21 Members
- Region 11 Stoke-on-Trent Wedgewood 8 Members
- Region 15 Lapworth Exits 9 Members
- Region 19 Hoddesdon 15 Members
- Region 22 Newton Abbot 19 Members
- Region 24 Horsham 12 Members
- Region 24 Crowborough 13 Members

I will be bringing these requests formally to the Council meeting in July.

In contrast, I have received several emails in support of the rule change, with many Clubs having formally added their previous 'honorary' members to CAS.

New affiliation

Nat Pres Jim and I were very pleased to visit Sheffield 41 Club and formally present Chairman Neil Skinner and their 17 Members with their inaugural Charter Certificate.

Round Table Family Liaison

It is essential that 41 Club National Councillors proactively engage with their Round Table equivalents, to raise awareness of what 41 Club has to offer. I have discussed the need for improved awareness and engagement with Members of the RTBI Board - especially their Membership Officer Andy Thorne and their Chairman of RT Regional Councillors Charlie Eurell – and we now have the full contact details of their Councillors and how 41 Club Regions map with the RTBI Regions and Areas.

This has been shared with all 41 Club National Councillors, who have been encouraged to reach out to RTBI and work together in support of Nat Pres Jim's 'side by side' approach to working.

In addition, I organised the first Round Table Family Membership Zoom call in May with the National Membership Officers of Round Table (Andy Thorne), Tangent (Josie Blackburn) and Ladies Circle (Gillian Ashworth). We shared our respective Clubs' situations, opportunities and challenges and will be holding regular sessions going forward.

Area XRT Clubs

Another initiative that is being reviewed and encouraged is the establishing of 'Area XRT Clubs' – a new way to attract new Members from Round Table aged 40+ who want to do active events but haven't joined a traditional 41 Club either because they don't want to, or a local 41 Club doesn't exist.

The term 'Area' helps aligns it to the Round Table structure, giving new Members a connection from their existing Round Table Area whilst providing an initial step towards joining a new type of 41 Club within the 41 Club Association.

Rory Tompsett has had success with the Area 36 XRT, and the Membership Committee are looking at the benefits of expanding this initiative across the Association.

I am also looking at improving our Social Media footprint to focus on Membership as well as submitting articles to the National publications and social media of the other three RT Family Clubs.

In addition to my direct liaisons with Clubs, I am very keen to accompany Councillors to any Club and Regional meetings to discuss about Membership – please invite me!

Back in January, I submitted my report for National Council. Just in case you missed it (and most did) most of it is repeated here and the comments still apply.

We still have a lot of Clubs who are meeting irregularly, and the usual meeting nights are often moved to accommodate the availability of eateries or the activity of the Club so it is difficult to predict when a meeting may be taking place. Club visits are therefore very difficult to arrange if people don't return calls and ignore emails.

The problem that this region is experiencing goes back several years. After my predecessor came off Council, we spent several years without representation, during which time the Clubs managed perfectly well doing their own thing. Having managed in this way, they now appear to be continuing in the same vein, i.e. not wanting or needing National input into their month to month activities.

What many of my Clubs want out of 41 Club is a chance to regularly meet up with their friends, have a bit of a chin wag and then it's 'see you next month'. I have to say that if that is what they want out of the Club, the answer to what National does for them is very difficult to answer. I get the impression that several Clubs pay their capitation just so that they can call themselves a 41 Club, it is nothing to do with anything going on outside their town as it simply doesn't interest them.

41 Club is not appealing to people leaving Table. This appears to be due to the age gaps that exist and the fact that some 45 year olds have very little in common with somebody in their 70s or 80s. The idea of continued friendship doesn't apply as the 45 year old doesn't know the 75 year old in the first place so there is no friendship to continue. I know the answer has been for the younger element to start another Club, but the problem is that there are insufficient numbers leaving Table (due to the decline in their own membership) to start a new Club and the effort involved is too much when they can probably find what they are looking for somewhere else (Lions or Masons for example) which is already established. I have accepted an invitation from my local Table to be their President for a year to try to help them grow and will be attending various Area events over the coming weeks. It is a major

disappointment that I have been on National Council for over 2 years and despite my best efforts to establish contacts in Table, we are only just now being provided with any details of our counterparts in Round Table. For me, it is way too late as I'm already making my own arrangements to meet Tablers face to face.

I have several Members requesting no contact from National. They see very little of interest in the newsletters and the magazine and many have asked me to take them off the circulation lists.

This is very similar to the content of my report for NC in Okehampton and as I discussed with Wynn earlier today, I am massively disappointed that the report solicited a quick email saying 'let's have a chat about it' which did not happen and that has been followed by absolutely nothing. On the basis that nobody really seemed to care about what I said, I deliberately didn't send in a report for the meeting in Cardiff. What was said? Nothing – again.

We seem to be going round and round in circles now and Councillors and Council meetings seem to discuss the same things repeatedly and we are not getting anywhere.

I know this is not the positive message you probably want to hear but you need to know what is going on out there as it is no good for Council and the Board to think everything in the garden is rosy when it isn't. I told Wynn today that after Cardiff I was very close to throwing in the towel. He's asked me not to at the moment.... watch this space
