The charity was established by Doddie Weir and the trustees in November 2017 following Doddie's diagnosis with MND. It was founded in response to his frustration at the lack of options given to MND patients – no effective treatment, no access to meaningful clinical trials and no hope. The aims of the Foundation are simple:

- To raise funds to aid research into the causes of MND and investigate potential cures.
- To make grants to individuals suffering from MND, to enable them to live as fulfilled a life as possible.

Motor Neurone Disease Association

The MND Association improve care and support for people with MND and their families and carers. We fund research that leads to new understanding and treatments and brings us closer to a world free of MND. We campaign and raise awareness, so the needs of people affected by MND are recognised and addressed by wider society.



We are sure you already know that the Round Table Family has been providing much needed humanitarian aid to the people of the Ukraine since the war started, directed through the Round Table Family Foundation Germany (Stiftung Round Table Family Deutschland) and in particular their Convoys of Hope. Support from 41 Clubs and individual 41ers has been outstanding but as the war continues, help is needed even more. That's why the Round Table Family are at the forefront in supporting the House of Hope, a much-needed sanctuary in Moldova for Ukrainian refugees.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?



You will remember that earlier in the year we told you Graham Hunter, the Chairman of London Old Tablers Society (LOTS) has "Taken the Pledge" for the whole of 2024 and a lot of people have already offered to donate £10 to the House of Hope for every stone in weight that he loses.

To date Graham has lost 2 stone but is still "Keeping the Pledge" until the final weigh in at the 2024 European Capitals Meeting (ECM) in Copenhagen on Saturday 28th September.

In Graham's own words "4 stone = 25 kg or 1 bag of plaster. A 25kg bag of plaster costs approximately £10.00 at most DIY stores, which will cover approximately 10m2 of a wall. £10.00 is how much we are asking for each stone of weight I lose before the ECM in September. If I achieve my target, each sponsor will have helped buy at least 4 bags of plaster.

So far, I have lost 2 stone, so each generous soul could buy 2 bags each. Help me and the House of Hope cover those walls".



The standard 2-night packages Friday to Sunday are priced at £230pp for single occupancy or £190pp sharing a twin room which includes Dinner B&B plus lunch on the Saturday.

For those who want to make most of the facilities 3-night packages are available, priced at £310pp single occupancy and £255 sharing in a twin room. This package includes Dinner B&B plus lunch on both Friday and Saturday.

Insurance Review

Accidents do happen - and so do claims!

During the past few months, we have reviewed our insurance programme to ensure that clubs and members are protected as well as possible. This includes increasing our Public Liability cover to £20m, particularly for national and large regional and charitable events, reflecting increases in payout awards and the 'No Blame' culture.

To assist clubs, we have published several documents providing information on our current arrangements and advice on running events - the main one being the **41 Club Insurance Guide 2024 /25**, which can be found on the website.

This provides a summary of the policies and automatic cover being provided for the majority of activities arranged by clubs. However, as with all insurance policies there are always exclusions and conditions in respect of specific activities and examples of these, where special arrangements are required are also included.

It recommended that clubs read the insurance guide as cover may need to be reviewed to meet the requirements of individual club, area and / regional events, especially if they are potentially hazardous or high-risk activities.


