Repairs would have meant а complicated refurbishment, with costs running into the many thousands of pounds.





Luckily, some of the Round Table's retired exmembers - now members of Crewe & Nantwich 41 Club, offered to donate their time, experience and skills to complete the refurbishment at no cost, apart from the materials that were needed.

Chris Meredith, current President of the ex-Round Table members 41 Club said..."Our amazing Christmas Float was generously built by Crewe based Whitby Morrison Ice Cream Vans back in 2015. Since then it has helped us raise over £110,000 but cold, wet and sometimes snowy weather had sadly taken its toll on the floor.

Replacing the floor with a superior material has been a mammoth task, but we have all got stuck in and the new floor should hopefully last another 20 years! As ex-Round Table members it's our way to help current members continue to be able spread festive cheer and raise much-needed funds to support local worthy causes".





It was a major undertaking - the work entailed stripping the trailer back to its bare steel chassis to undertake restorative rust treating, paintwork and floor replacement - and then fully rebuilt and rewired again, to look and sound as good as new for the run-up to this Christmas.

Sean Liddle, Chairman of Crewe & Nantwich District Round Table said, "Our Santa float collections are the highlight of our year, spreading Christmas joy to our community and enabling us to fundraise for local good causes and charities. In the past year we have been able to donate an amazing £23,000 across lots of different causes and we hope to have another brilliant year collecting, now that we have a revitalised float.



Quite simply we wouldn't be able to go out and do our collections this year without the hard work and dedication of our friends in 41 Club to repair our float for which we are ever grateful."

It is worth saying that as a 41 Club with excellent membership numbers and with an age spread from midforties to mid-seventies, we know we are very lucky to still have a feeder RT and value their membership hugely. We do what we can and whenever we can to support our RT guys...it's an important ethos of our 41 Club.





It was founded in response to his frustration at the lack of options given to MND patients – no effective treatment, no access to meaningful clinical trials and no hope. The aims of the Foundation are simple:

- To raise funds to aid research into the causes of MND and investigate potential cures.
- To make grants to individuals suffering from MND, to enable them to live as fulfilled a life as possible.

The MND Association improve care and support for people with MND and their families and carers. We fund research that leads to new understanding and treatments and brings us closer to a world free of MND. Membership Roadshows – Relearning to Adopt, Adapt & Improve

I have regularly shared with you that not enough Tablers (only 10%) join their local 41 Club after they leave Table. The reasons for this are various – but the primary reason being that Tablers leaving still wanted to take part in more active 'Table-style' activities and perceived rightly or wrongly that their local 41 Clubs were just not attractive to them.

The bottom line is that if 41 Clubs really wanted to increase their members, they have to take a long look at themselves and become more attractive to prospective joiners.

To support Clubs who wanted to do this, six weekend Membership Roadshows were scheduled in 2024/25 around the Country. Four have been held in Leeds, Bristol, Leicester and Maidstone with the remaining two taking place in Perth on 1st & 2nd February and in Thurrock on 22nd & 23rd March. To date approximately 90 delegates representing around 75 Clubs have attended and the feedback has been really positive.

Each Roadshow is a combination of interactive presentations, discussions and breakout sessions, providing attendees with a practical range of ideas, tools and techniques on how to grow their Clubs, including growing their online presence, building an engaging programme, and attracting ex-Tablers and invited members from the local Community.

It is not just a one-year investment to focus on membership however, rather it will continue to be a National initiative and priority focus every year going forward **with six more roadshows being planned for other regions of GB&I in 2025/26 – venues and dates to be released in the New Year.**

HYM Bern, Switzerland 2024

This was not received particularly well by a number of nations including ourselves and that the International Treasurer was left in no doubt that a lot more review work would be required to take this forward in any capacity.

The Rules Workshop went over the current rule changes whilst the Regions Workshop went through the proposed changes to have 41 Club countries divided into regions. All 3 workshops will be held again at the World Meeting in Iceland next year where further progress will be presented and debated on.

The Friday night was the traditional fancy-dress night with the theme being Swiss chic. Needless to say, this theme had a very wide interpretation, from cheese themed costumes, traditional Swiss dress to the Sweden RT Family members who went fullblown ABBA. We had a traditional Swiss buffet meal, accompanied by Swiss music both traditional and modern with a disco at the end. The disco highlight was The Proclaimers and "I Will Walk 500 Miles" had to be played, which allowed myself and Colin McKenzie to promote our AGM in Aviemore with lots of whisky being shared.







The HYM AGM was held in a roof top Conference Centre with spectacular views over the city of Bern and with a full complement of delegates and observers present the meeting progressed. There were several presentations put forward, in particular for the Full Year Meeting (FYM) in Israel 2026. Delegates agreed that if there were no ceasefire by the end of Jan 2025, then Israel 41 Club would step down from hosting. Presentations were given for the FYM in Iceland and the HYM in India in 2025. Unfortunately, due to time constraints, the AGM did not get through all the required business, which will now be dealt with in the World Meeting in Iceland 2025.

The evening gala was held in a very upscale basement restaurant, with traditional Swiss food, followed by a band and disco. Needless to say, the party made its way back to the hotel, where the last remnants left at 4.30am in morning after much networking.



All in all, an excellent HYM and thoroughly enjoyed by over 400 RT Family members especially the GB&I contingent, which also took part in the pre-tour organised by the Switzerland 41Club, look forward to seeing all travellers again in Iceland in May 2025.









Is It Ever Too Late?

Paul Cole, a member of Edgbaston Birmingham 41 club and a past member of both Thirsk (North Yorkshire) and Edgbaston Round Tables, thinks not.



Paul, throughout his life has always made time for sport and exercise, and when 55 years old, shortly after losing both his parents he met a man known affectionately as Blind Dave Heeley, whose inspiration prompted Paul to run the London Marathon and raise almost £6k for Macmillan Cancer Support. Shortly after, Dave invited Paul to run again in the London Marathon, this time for Guide Dogs. For Dave this was the final leg of an amazing 7 marathons on 7 continents in 7 days. Subsequently Paul ran 30 marathons in support of Acorns Children's Hospice a local charity.

In 2019 an experienced race cyclist suggested that Paul train and complete the Birmingham Velo a 103-mile closed road event. This appealed to Paul as he's always viewed road cycling as a very dangerous adventure and the thought of cycling in a traffic free environment was ideal. He duly purchased his first 'road bike' and only ventured out on the public roads five time before the first Velo, having trained for extended periods on gym-based spinning bikes. Whilst fit from his first ride he completed the 'Tour of Cambridge' and Yorkshire Velos.

The arrival of Covid caused most Velo type events to be cancelled and prompted Paul to look to a different sport for fitness -Swimming.









Throughout his life Paul had never learned how to swim a recognised stroke and he was determined to become a proficient freestyle swimmer. Thanks to Jon Cook, the father of his son-in-law, he'd found someone who would help him. Despite developing a good style and even with swimming three or four times a week Paul found his heart rate high and was only able to swim around about ten lengths continuously. Then it happened suddenly. Paul found himself being able to swim for over an hour without stopping. And effortlessly!

At around this time a close family member passed away and their wish was that the congregation at the funeral contribute to a charity called 'The Pituitary Foundation'.



Paul responded to this by setting up a charity page and completing three challenges before his 75th birthday namely:

An abseil from the top of Anfield Stadium



A 5k (3.1 mile, 200 lengths) Swimathon



The London 103 mile Cycle Velo

Paul successfully completed all three challenges. Over the period from his first marathon Paul has raised over £40k.

Paul would be happy to attend other 41 Club meetings to talk about his experiences. He would do this for a small fee which he would pass on to the Pituitary Foundation.

For he's a jolly good fellow!





CAMBERLEY 41 CLUB REACHES THE SUMMIT OF AMBITION

At a recent Dinner Meeting, the Club proudly welcomed HARI BUDHA, the world's first double amputee to summit Mount Everest to give the after dinner speech.

As a former Corporal in the British Army's legendary Gurkha regiment, Hari lost both of his legs in Afghanistan following an IED explosion in 2010.

Not wanting disability to stop him, he has been continually working to positively transform the way people with a disability are perceived, and how they perceive themselves. In 2018, he joined forces with other climbers and disability organisations, and in 2023 successfully summited Mount Everest.





With this amazing achievement he is inspiring other people facing similar circumstances to believe anything is possible with the right mindset. Hari has blazed new trails for people with disabilities. He has kayaked around the Isle of Wight, completed multiple skydives, paraglided and bungee jumped, and is now embarked on completed his climbs of the highest mountain in all 5 continents.

His talk was humbling, emotional, and inspirational. Everyone was enthralled, and rightly so. Hari received a standing ovation driven by respect and awe for his achievements. His message that anything is possible if you fight off negativity and drive relentlessly to achieve your goal, was pertinent not just to people with physical disabilities but also to each and every one of us as we fight our own anxieties and self imposed barriers to success.

The Club presented Hari with a Donation of £300 to add to his fund assisting Disabled people to achieve a better life. To learn more go to Hari's website at https://www.haribudhamagar.com

XRT: Shirley Late Knights 41 Club Adapt their ways A divorce averted

Shirley Late Knights (SLK), as Shirley 41 Club are known, is a strong well attended club. We have about 50 members and at our last dinner meeting in November about 40 of them were there. We have numerous sub-groups, including walking football, golf, board gamers, drinking groups, dining groups, travelling groups, classic car clubs, train enthusiast groups and many more.

What we don't have is a steady flow of new members into SLK when they leave Shirley Round Table (SRT). So, our average age is gradually creeping up.

For over 50 years we have operated a subs system whereby we pay £150 a year for membership, and that includes all the usual capitation fees, but also six meal and speaker meetings per year. Everything else is on a pay-as-you-go basis. Many of us have thought that this is one of the strengths of the club- you have paid up front for your meal so you may as well go to the meeting. Hence 40 members out of 50 at our last meeting perhaps.

But there have always been members who thought that we should move over to pay-as-you-go, and with the changing nature of work for Tablers many of their members thought the same and have told us so.

Tablers leaving SRT have said that the major reason for not joining was the way we pay for six meals in our subs. Many in SLK thought that they might not want to join what they saw as an "Old Man's Club". One which they perhaps thought of as "just a dining club", even though in reality, it isn't. We, in SLK always felt that if they were to join, then they would get the same carry over of friendship in the long term that the rest of us have so much enjoyed.

Because of their concerns about subs, some of those leaving SRT were proposing to set up a separate Shirley XRT club, a route that has now been sanctioned by 41 National. Many of SLK's members thought that the splintering of the XRT club from SLK would in the long run be good for neither group, even if they were a 41 Club affiliated organisation. We would drift apart. As everyone inevitably got older SLK would probably wither and eventually die. So, the committee of SLK came up with a proposal to adapt our existing rules, so that Shirley XRT should in effect be a part of the main SLK, but be organised in a partly independent way.

This was the proposal:

- 1. A single SLK club with an active Xtra night on the 3rd Thursday of each month.
 - 1.1 A new committee post will be created called X events organiser.
 - 1.2 All SLK members are welcome to attend these Xtra events nights.

1.3 X members are full members of SLK and can stand for any SLK committee posts.

2. X members can attend all SLK nights including meal nights on Pay as You Go basis.

2.1 Transferring to this PAYG membership will be open to any SLK member currently under 50 years olds (4 people) and any new ex-SRT joiners. Once on this PAYG membership they can stay on it permanently.

2.2 Dinner/speaker nights to be charged at full meal cost £27 + £2 towards speaker costs.

2.3 X annual subs to be £20 National + £10 local for SLK admin costs.

2.4 XRT members are under no obligation to attend meals nights, but hopefully they will.

Advantages:

- Continuing friendship between past Tablers old and new with a single route after Table
- Single Treasurer/ Secretary/ Beer Festival/ 4 Clubs liaison etc
- No conflict for Table over Honoraries/ Presidents/ support for Joint Table events
- New SLK members that previously did not join us

There was a very healthy discussion. Then, to allow those members to vote who were not able to vote in person, as they were away, we held a PollsEZ vote on WhatsApp.

There was an overwhelming vote in favour (33 for, 5 against and 7 abstentions).

What did we learn?

- 41 Clubs have to listen and adapt. Be flexible. The new ex-Tablers will eventually take over, so what do they want?
- In particular, listen to what the RT members retiring from RT are saying about why they won't join their 41 Club.
- See if you can address their concerns and avoid a divorce, perhaps by setting up a sub-group within the original 41 Club. We have conceded a 50-year-old practise. From the point of view of the SLK members this was not something to do lightly. But we have changed.
- Let everyone have a vote with PollsEZ.
- Keep the vote tight and directed to the proposal on its own, don't let it get subsumed into a general discussion about the future of the club. If needs be, make the point that any such discussions are appropriate to the AGM. Keep the two issues apart.

Will it be a success in the long term? We don't know, but the omens are good in that one past SRT member has already joined. And if it is a success, it will be good for SLK, SRT and those retiring from SRT.

Maybe worth thinking of doing something similar in your club?
